

MCEPS Chinese Cultural Day 2023

On June 5th and June 8th, Sinofield teachers visited Mosman Church of England Preparatory School (MCEPS) to assist in organizing a two-day Chinese Culture event. A total of 122 students from grades 3 to 6 participated in calligraphy, paper cutting, Chinese painting, and bracelet making classes. During the activities, the students not only had the opportunity to experience various aspects of Chinese culture but also took their artistic creations home as souvenirs!

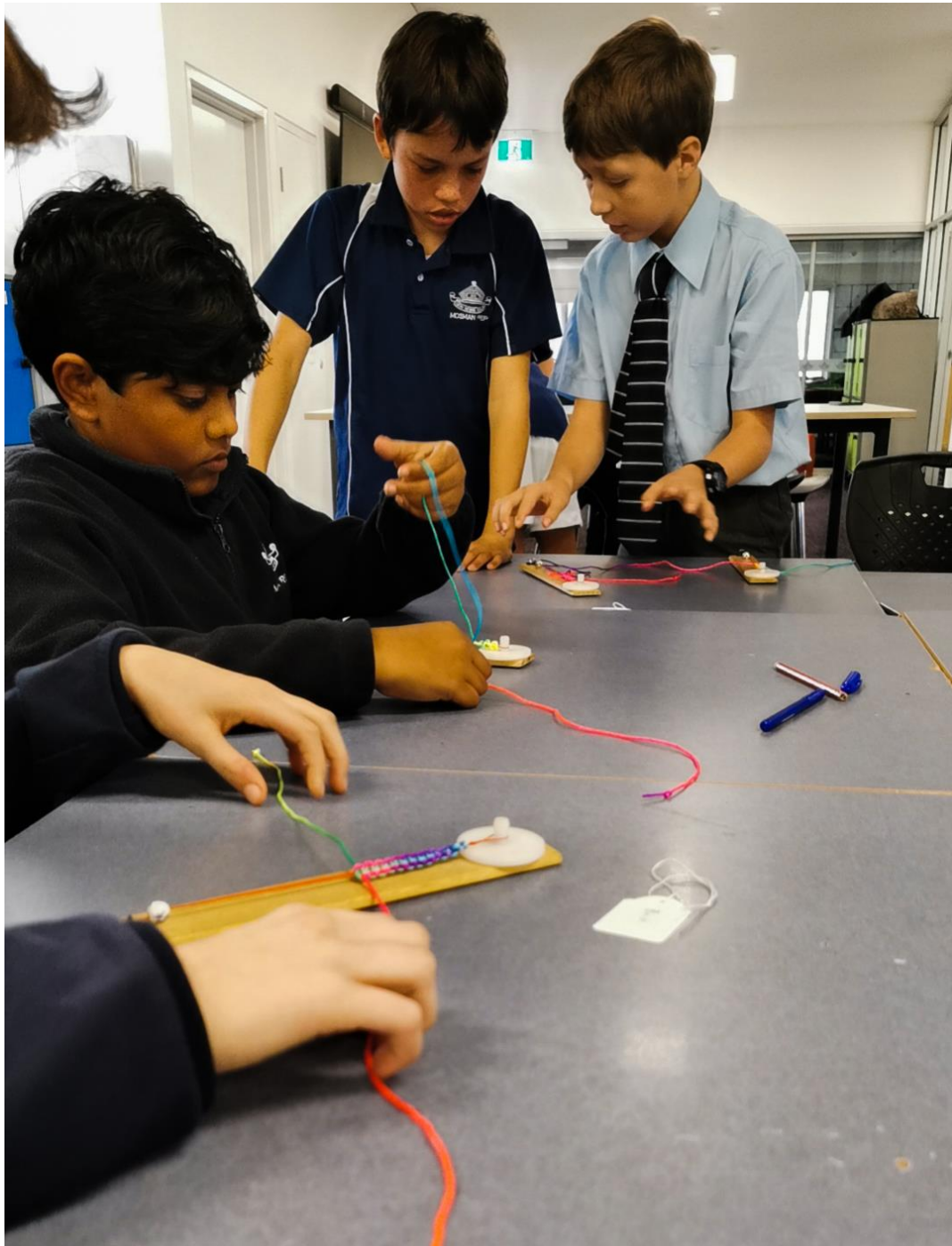
Paper Cutting

The paper cutting class allowed students to experience the traditional Chinese art of paper cutting. They learned the basic techniques and pattern designs, and then created their own paper cutting artworks. Students learned the Chinese character "spring" and crafted a 3D representation of it, showcasing their fine craftsmanship.



Bracelet Making

The bracelet making class allowed students to learn the traditional Chinese technique of bracelet weaving. Students used colorful threads and beads to create beautiful and unique Dragon Boat Festival bracelets. This activity not only encouraged students to unleash their creativity but also provided insights into the cultural significance of the traditional Chinese festival, Dragon Boat Festival.



Chinese Calligraphy

During the calligraphy class, students learned the traditional art of Chinese writing. They practiced the basic strokes and structures of Chinese characters using brushes and ink on paper. Through observing demonstrations and receiving guidance from the teachers, students gradually mastered the techniques and aesthetic principles of calligraphy. They wrote simple Chinese characters and words in their own brushstrokes and style, experiencing the unique charm of Chinese calligraphy.



Chinese Painting

In the Chinese painting class, students created artwork of cherries using brushes and ink. They learned the fundamental techniques of Chinese painting, such as the application of ink, brushwork, and landscape depiction. Under the guidance of the teachers, students showcased their artistic talents and imagination, resulting in exquisite creations.
